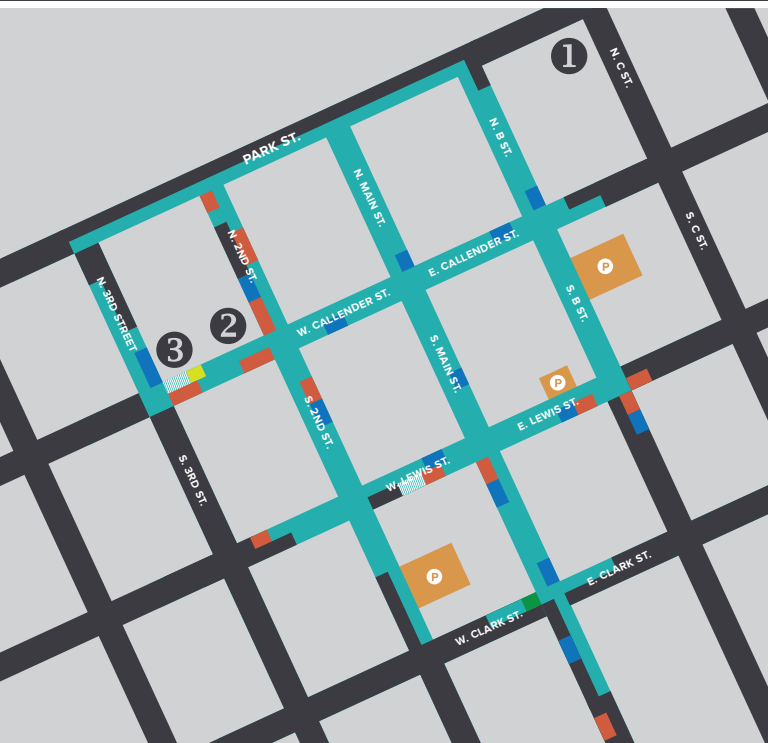




HANDY GUIDE TO PARKING IN DOWNTOWN LIVINGSTON



USE THIS MAP TO FIND PLACES TO PARK.

If you plan to stay for more than 2 hours, there are plenty of long-term parking options within a short walk of your destination in town. Taking a stroll keeps the short-term parking available for business customers and gives you a chance to explore downtown Livingston along the way!

ROLLING RULE

In 2024, the Livingston City Commission adjusted its parking rules to ensure the availability of parking within the 2-hour zone. The new rules prevent someone from moving their vehicle within the same block to avoid the time limit. Moving your vehicle within the same block to avoid the 2-hour limit, or leaving to return to the same block, may result in an overtime parking fine.



PRIORITY PARKING

Customers are our priority. To promote a business-friendly downtown, the City aims to keep short-term parking spaces available for customers. Business owners and employees are encouraged to park in long-term locations.



TAKE GOOD CARE OF YOUR PETS

We love your pets! Please don't leave them unattended in vehicles under dangerous conditions. Heat exhaustion is common and can lead to heat stroke. Even on cloudy 70° days, temperatures inside vehicles can quickly reach 115°!

STREET SWEEPING

Livingston's street sweeping schedule normally runs from May-August, for the first 2 full weeks of each month. In the downtown area, the street sweeping occurs in the early morning hours. Please be mindful of parking your car in the downtown core from 5-7am during our street sweeping season.



NOW LET'S SAY IT'S WINTER

Whether it's snowing or not, you need to remove your car from the streets the morning after more than 3 inches of snow falls. That's when the plows and other winter road maintenance vehicles get to work!
